OAYPA Policy Paper Working Group - Call for Members!

OAYPA is working with Laurier Hub for Community Solutions to develop a policy paper that will examine: 1) currently available live-in intensive treatment programs available to pregnant and parenting transitional aged youth (TAY) and their children, in Ontario; 2) demographics of TAY who access these programs; 3) literature on promising practices for live-in intensive treatment (LIT) and day treatment programs for TAY. The objectives for this study are to highlight strengths, challenges, opportunities, and recommendations for LIT and day programs across Ontario to best serve TAY and their children, and identify alignments between current programs and provincial funding mandates for such programs.

The Ontario Nonprofit (ONN) Survey Report reviews the results of their 4th Annual sector-wide survey that was held in June-July 2023. It contains access to a Policy Report that is timely and very relevant to our sector, including calls to action for the nonprofit sector. You will find an alignment between this report and our many discussions about sustainability. It also includes resources that will help us use this data, recommendations for government and a technical report with data highlights.

Infant and Early Mental Health Promotion Impact Report 2022-2023: Highlights include; working with communities to further integrate the Nurturing the Seed program and create Pathways for infant and early mental health services, Launching the Nurturing the Seed mobile app, Co-creating the Natural Helpers for the Children Learning Circle, Running the 2022 Lecture Series: Laying the Path for Lifelong Wellness, hosting the Expanding Horizons National Institute, Supporting the launch of Canada's first National Database on Child Development

The *Loneliness Project* is a research study where youth shared valuable knowledge about what it is like to navigate transitions to housing and to stay stably housed before and during the pandemic. The researchers conducted interviews with 22 young women and gender-diverse youth as well as 12 service providers and informal support people. The Loneliness Project Report can be found here.
