


Book Launch: Adolescent Pregnancy and Parenting

This book focuses on the impact of social stigma on adolescents who are at high risk of teen pregnancy. It describes and discusses personal and social factors that predispose them to becoming pregnant and having babies; factors that may subsequently protect or more often, compromise outcomes for both parents and children.

Ontario Community Health Compensation Market Salary Review

Ontario's community health sector is facing a critical staffing crisis, stemming from a widening wage gap between community health care workers and health workers in other sectors (the community sector is more than \$2 billion behind on wages). Action from the Ontario government is needed to close this gap and secure the stability of Ontario's health care system. While the government has committed to strengthening the community health sector, the growing wage gap threatens the system's ability to deliver the community services Ontarians need, including primary care, home care, mental health and addictions care, and long-term care. Policy Paper - Request for Financial Support

As you know, OAYPA secured the support of Dr. Melody Morton Ninomiya and her research team at Wilfrid Laurier University (WLU) to create a policy paper for OAYPA and its members. This policy paper will be a multipronged study that examines:

The objectives for this study are to highlight strengths, challenges, opportunities, and recommendations for day programs and LIT across OAYPA member agencies to best serve TAY and their children and identify alignments between current programs and provincial funding mandates for such programs. This study aims to provide up-to-date evidence to inform how future programs and services can best serve pregnant and parenting TAY, and with adequate resources to support the programs and services.

We were successful in receiving a matching grant from WLU but a remaining cost of \$25,000 is needed to support the completion of this work. We are requesting that member agencies help contribute toward the shared costs of this very important policy paper. OAYPA will use this paper to support advocacy efforts regarding resource allocation decisions with MCCSS and other provincial partners.

ACTION

We are proposing a shared cost across members (\$1,000/agency). We have created an <u>online form</u> to help determine the funding commitment each agency is able to offer. We would appreciate if you can consider this request and provide us with your funding commitment before **Jan 31st, 2024,** to reconcile costs before the end of the fiscal year. <u>Centering Black Youth Wellbeing – A Certificate on Combatting Anti-Black Racism</u>- <u>Registration</u> dates - December 18 – January 17, 2024.

This certificate will support a structural transformation in Ontario's youth sector that centers the wellbeing of Black young people and their families in our individual practices and organizational policies. The certificate includes 17 lectures and 2 artistic performances organized around four modules (~12-16 hrs. commitment over 3 months). The learning is self-paced over four weeks running from Jan 22 to March 15, 2024. Complete all four modules and earn a Certificate of Completion and a LinkedIn Badge from YouthREX based at York University. This training aligns well with OAYPA's EDIB goals.
